At the Townscape Advisory Committee Meeting held 15 February 2022, an item – Art Project \$25,000 Budget Allocation, was presented to the TAC to discuss what art project the funding should be expended on. The TAC discussed this item and made the following recommendation:

"That the \$25,000 Budget allocation for Art Work be spent on mural/s at the following prioritized locations:

- Good Shed Wall (West side);
- Railway Station Store Room Wall (East side);
- Western Power Transformer Box (between Jessie House and Alby Park);
- Irrigation Water Tank at Gnarojin Park; and
- Irrigation Water Tank at Memorial Park."

The following action was discussed and recorded in the minutes:

"The EMTRS, in consultation with Acting MCL, will send out a RFQ/EOI to a number of mural artists, inclusive of indigenous, local, regional and metropolitan. The RFQ will require the artist to submit an example of their recommended art work for each location and to give a price for that mural art work to be supplied and completed by the artist. Results from submissions from interested artists will be presented back to the Committee for review and a decision to be made on which mural/s will be applied to which locations. The EMTRS will request a TAC meeting once submissions have been received which is envisaged to be in mid to late March 2022."

Local artist Ross Storey has not confirmed with the administration, either through his submission or by follow up telephone conversation that he has insurance, so due to potential liability issues that the Shire may face if this supplier, (or any other supplier without Public Liability insurance), was to be engaged and an accident occurred, this supplier will not be able to be considered. The only way around this is to condition any contract offered to be subject to furnishing of said insurance for the duration of the contract. Insurance, through providers such as BizCover, can be as little as \$30 per month (payable monthly).

Local artist Georgina Paterson has advised that she is able to have temporary insurance for this work should she be engaged, which would be sufficient.

It is noted that the Shire's Public Art Contribution Policy Guidelines are intended to support the Public Art Strategy & Masterplan 2019 and the Shire of Narrogin Public Art Contribution Policy.

- **3.** Consultation should take place with the RSL prior to the mural at memorial park being approved.
- **4.** Administration to consult with western power prior to works commencing on their asset.

I have painted murals at the Mukinbudin Pool.










I worked with the Community Resource Centre with their Character Community Art Project. We the created different characters which are displayed around town for the International Year of Farming Families.




















5. ACTION TRACKER UPDATE
